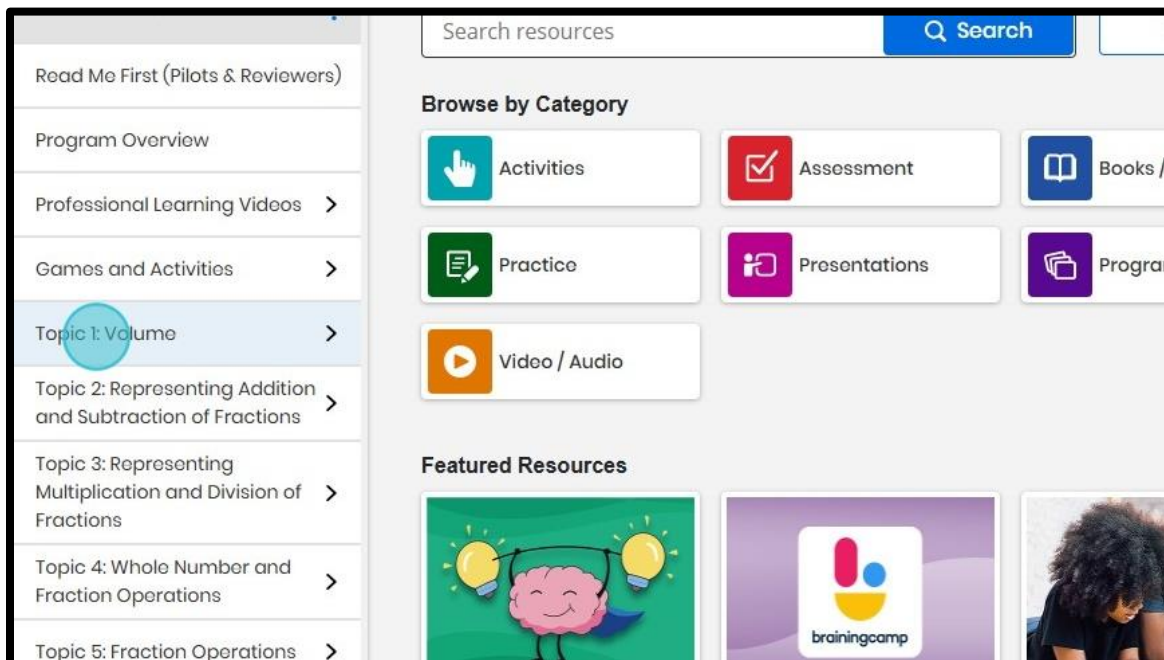


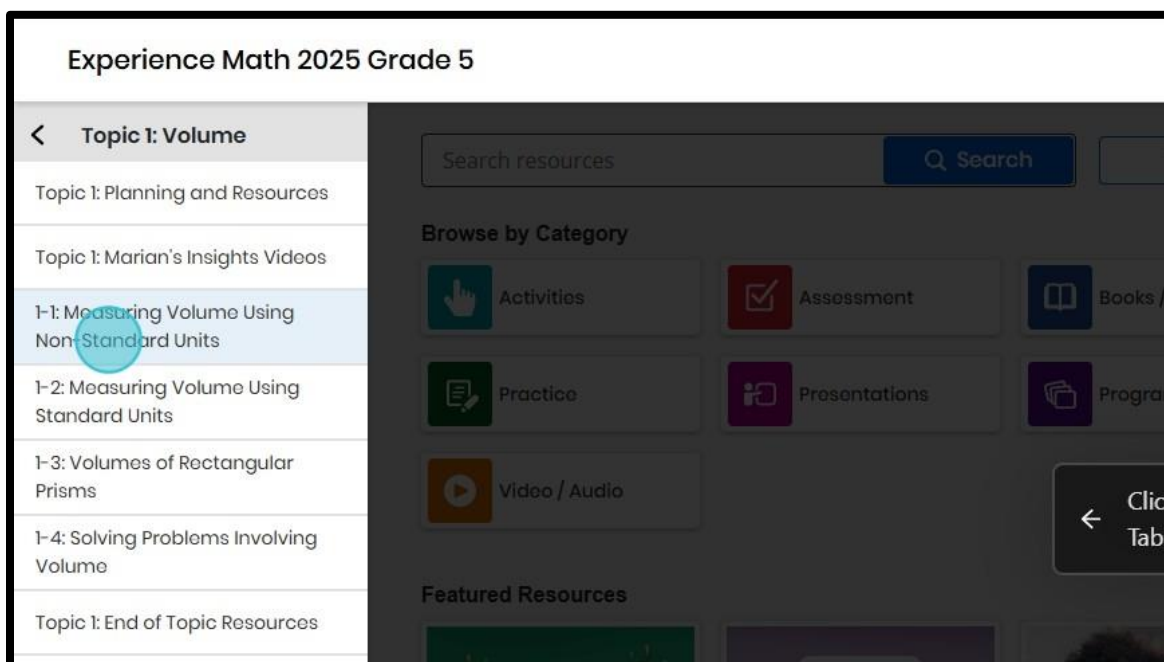
Additional Practice at the Lesson Level

Steps to Success:

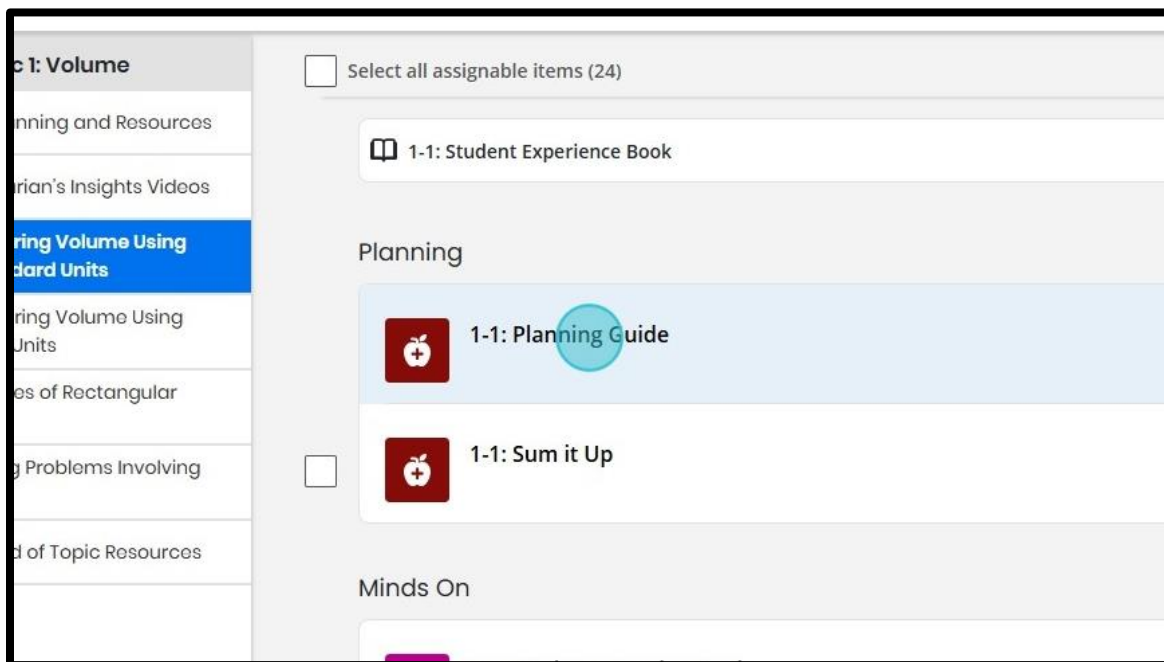
1. Navigate to your **Experience Math** dashboard. Click on a **Topic** in the Table of Contents.



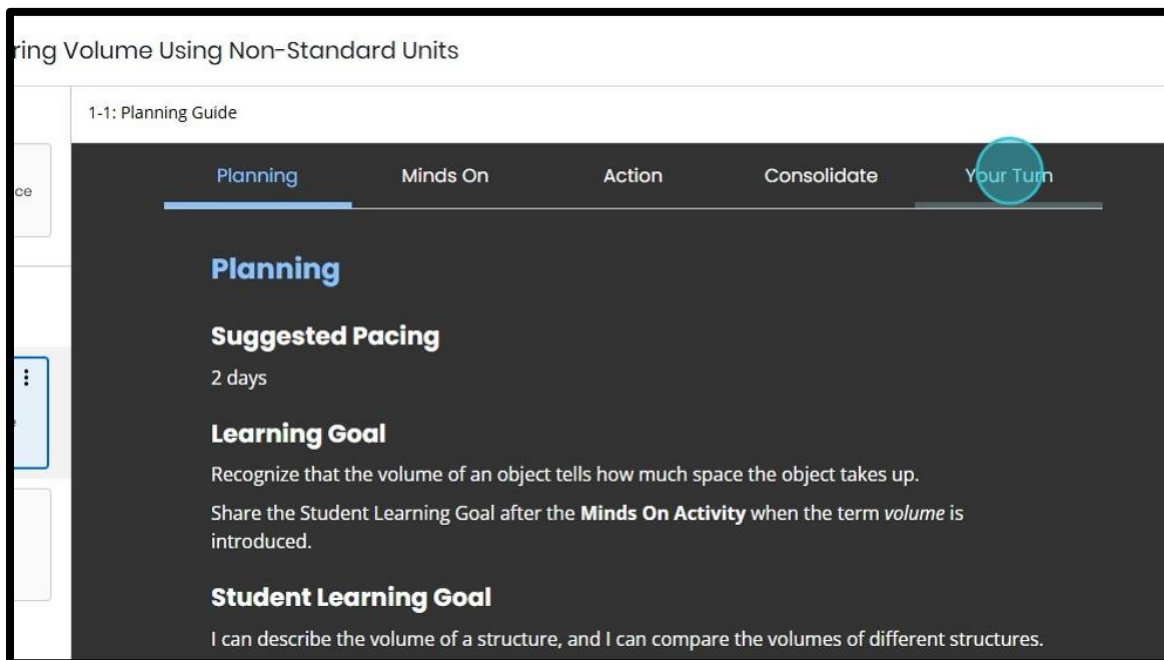
2. Click on a **Lesson**.

How You Could Handle This

Before assigning the **Your Turn Questions**, review the Learning Goal to remind students of the lesson focus. Then ask students to describe one thing they learned in the lesson.

Based on students' responses to the discussion, you may choose to share some or all of the **Lesson Summary** with them. You may also want to use the **Reteaching Activity** below.

Reteaching Activity

Materials

Connecting cubes (inches and centimeters)

If students are struggling with this activity, you might ask them to build something with 6 cubes. Inform students that we say the volume is 6 cubes, or 6 cubic units. Repeat with a few other numbers of cubes.

Then use a different size of cube and point out that if you use the smaller cube, the volume is still 6 if you use 6 cubes, but the unit is different.

Grouping

Students practice skills and concepts and apply what they have learned in this lesson.

And the Point Is ...

The **Your Turn Questions** provide an opportunity to collect assessment for learning information.

Your Turn Question 1 can be scored automatically.

Use Structure Question 4 asks students to consider the number of cube structures that could be built with 4 cubes versus the number of cube structures that could be built with 8 cubes.

If time is limited, have students complete Questions 2, 3, and 5.

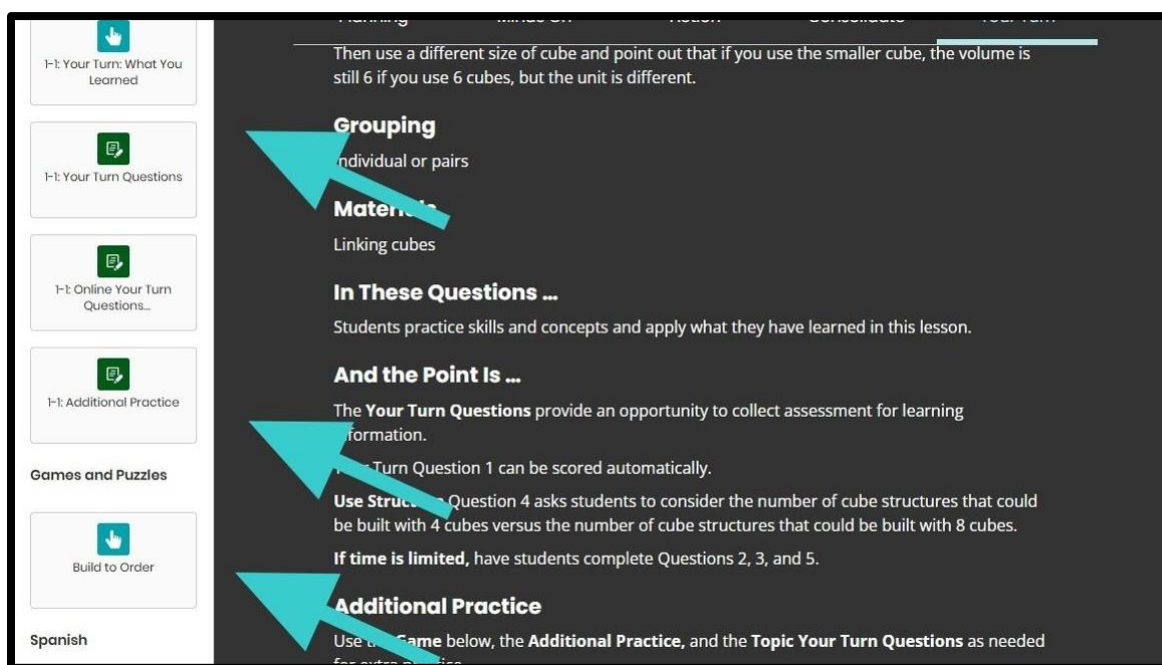
